

# **Betty Althan Quam**

Betty Althan Quam, 95 of Ames died on Tuesday, July 16, 2013 at Green Hills Health Care Center. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, July 19 in the Chet Ryan Mortuary, 708 Fifth Street in Nevada with Pastor David R. Burling officiating. Burial will follow in the Roland Cemetery. Betty was born on March 16, 1918 in Roland to Eric and Amy (Gaard) Waugh. She was confirmed in the Salem Lutheran Church in Roland. Betty was a graduate of Roland High School and CCCC Business School. She was employed by the State of Iowa Conservation Commission prior to her April 11, 1941 marriage to Grant J. Quam in Glendale, CA. They moved back to the Ames area in 1945.
